DRAFT Notes for Sunday 29 September 2019 at 4 pm, Nightingale Garden

Chair: Bob Notes: Rebecca

Pre-meeting tea: we expressed our special thanks to Judit for all she has done for the garden and our very best wishes in her new life in the South of England. Ingrid expressed thanks on behalf of the Group to **Rebecca & Julian** for their time and energy (and wanted it minuted).

- 1. In attendance: Barbara, Bob, Gill, Immy, Ingrid, Jane, Judit, Julian, Keith, Lois, Peggy, Peter, Rebecca.
 - Apologies: Ben, Colin, Jill, Justin, Kate, Nat.
- 2. Minutes from the last meeting agreed.
- 3. Finances and fundraising:
 - a. Bank account etc: current balance is £196.97, after bills. Action: Julian to buy a new wheelbarrow and dispose of the broken one. Rebecca to find a home for the big square one. Julian to buy and install a rechargeable strip light as a temporary help in the toolshed.
- 4. Membership and Tempo time credits. Enthusiasm for remaining in the time credit scheme for as long as it is funded, at least March 2020. Action: **Rebecca** has fed this back to Tempo (30/9/19).
- 5. Notes on projects etc:
 - a. Green roof veranda: Still enthusiastic. Could install noticeboards, folding benches and tables. Knowing the cost will help us decide on improvements to the club but too and whether to get contractors it or work on it ourselves. Action: Rebecca to continue to liaise with Guy (expect quotes in first week of October 2019, for build before March 2020). Feedback to Group by e-mail and in person.
 - b. **Club hut**: Agreed to in principle:
 - i. Re-cladding the front for weather proofing and appearance: discuss in more detail when we know more about the veranda. Enthusiasm for Welsh larch or could just use ply and add noticeboards. Action: **Julian** to bring in samples of the larch.
 - ii. Enthusiasm for a new door to the front, which would be good for ventilation, and could be a 'stable/Dutch' door and act like a serving hatch. Action: Rebecca has conveyed to Guy (1/10/19).
 - iii. At least one **new window** at the front, maybe with larch shutters, would be nice, if we can afford it; Action: **Rebecca** has conveyed to Guy (1/10/19).
 - iv. We probably have the decking and expertise to make a small ramp up to the existing door and might need another one after the front veranda area is paved. Action: Rebecca has conveyed to Guy (1/10/19). Action: Julian and Rebecca construct one, with advice from Louise.
 - v. Adding ceiling insulation: would be good for very hot weather. Action: Rebecca has conveyed to Guy (1/10/19). Action: Julian and Rebecca install the small amount donated already. Price-up finishing it.
 - vi. An area next to the door for washing up. Action: plan for this, around the time a new door is installed.
 - vii. More cupboards. To continue to discuss.
 - c. Polytunnel: enthusiasm for a Spring 2020 install. Action: Rebecca sent spec to Guy for Feb 2020 order (done 1/10/19) and continue to work with Guy on agreement. Several people keen to get involved in the install. Will assume:
 - i. 12 ft x 20 ft, with sliding double doors at each end.

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- ii. Planting bed on one side (closest to the club hut) and weed membrane on the rest so we can use the space flexibly. Bars for hanging strings. Make raised beds and benches ourselves.
- iii. Can put pots on the ground (e.g. chillies and baby trees) and have staging for seedlings, which we will probably make from wood.
- iv. Could have a water point inside but it is close to the water butts.
- v. Orientate it at an angle to the club hut, in line with the trees between the minibeast mansion and leaf bins. Allow space for wheelchairs etc to enter and exit easily and not impede movement down the slope.

Suggestions of activities, which could have little 'learning together' sessions:

- 1. Growing dahlias from seed;
- 2. Tree grafting (including apples, apricots, pears, plums, quince)
- 3. Dividing plants;
- 4. Taking cuttings (including figs);
- 5. Baby plants and over-wintering;
- 6. Encourage others to use it for learning;
- 7. We could have some cooler/wetter weather meetings in it.
- d. Improved path to the garden. Enthusiastic. Action: Rebecca to update the Group if/when she hears anything.
- e. Impact of pavilion being demolished: Action: Rebecca to continue to ask for dates and temporary toilet provision. Rebecca/Julian to use airpots for hot water and temporary lights inside club hut and toolshed. Bronwen can lend us an extra airpot if it is needed.
- f. Flymo/McCulloch prizes: we have advertised to the Community Garden Group, Rock Allotments, on Facebook, Next Door. Action: Rebecca has sent details to Bronwen who has listed it on Ebay (30/9/19). Thanks Bronwen!
- g. **Policies and procedures**: Action: **Rebecca** to find some time and **Ingrid** will help. An overwinter job!
- h. **Produce from the garden**. Agreed our motivations for growing produce include (in no particular order) to learn how to grow produce; to eat the produce ourselves (although this year we have done this less than before); to demonstrate to park users how produce grows; to share produce with park users, which is happening more than in previous years (maybe even when we put large signs saying not to!); for aesthetics. We don't think it is desirable or feasible to stop people taking produce. In Incredible Edible, to which we are affiliated as a Frlend, all produce is promoted for sharing and labelled as 'take what you need'. Action: **Rebecca** (with others) to make more signs to make things clearer to park users. Continue to choose easy to grow produce plants, especially perennials, which also don't need so much watering.
- i. New projects and planting: enthusiasm for...
 - i. Action: In Spring 2020, **Rebecca** to start from seed two more kinds of artichoke and gather planlets in Feb 2020 of small Greek variety of **artichoke plants for cropping**.
 - ii. Action: Soon, dig up and give away plants from the small strawberry bed. Thin out existing Autumn raspberries and plant up.

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- iii. Action: continue to dig out narrow beds (including the existing runner bean bed) and transplant existing **rhubarb** (started 30/9/19). **Consider making a new rhubarb bed** in the lower area, after we know where the polytunnel will be.
- j. Dates and times for Group meetings: Agreed to cancel the November meeting (17 November 2019) and have ad hoc project-focussed meetings until the Spring. Then to have fixed, regular dates for meetings in March, an AGM in May and one in September (see below). All at 4pm.
- k. Winter close down and keeping in touch: for regular Sunday and Monday garden sessions. Agreed, the last one will be Sunday 1 December and we will have an end-of-year informal lunch party for regulars (see below). We can eat some winter squash.
 Action: Rebecca and others to look out for suitable opportunities over Winter to meet up at least once a week, especially afternoons. For example, cinema trips or meet-ups in local cafes (see below).
- I. **Learning/workshops:** Ben and Stepan enjoyed the recent one-day course at the Botanic Garden. The Botanic Garden might continue to offer learning opportunities. Ideas for learning at Nightingale are always welcome. We can do informal 'learning together' sessions using the expertise we already have. We could also think about partnering or 'buying in' expertise. Enthusiasm for 'learning together' natural dyeing, including with the Rock Road Library textile group. Action: review at next meeting.
